St. Stephen's Cathedral Vienna, Austria

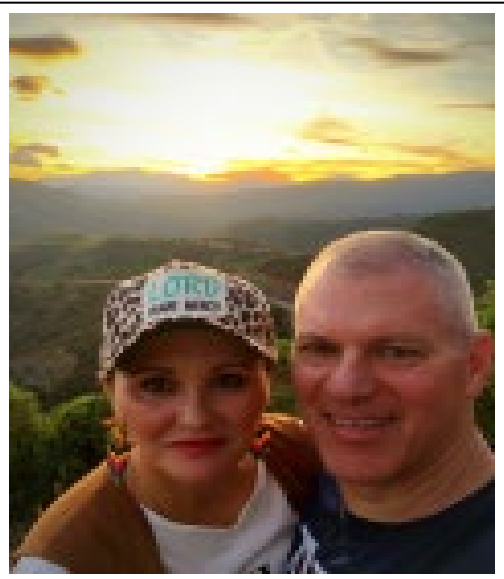
St. Stephen's Cathedral is at the very center of Vienna. First consecrated in 1147 and rebuilt after a massive fire in 1945, it was built in the middle of the city as a sign of the centrality of Christian worship to God in people's lives. Today, it is merely a symbol of a forgotten time in Europe's past, but God has not forgotten the people of Europe. God is raising up young people at Continental Theological Seminary to boldly proclaim Jesus as Lord in Europe. Please pray with us that people in Europe will once again put God at the center of their lives through faith in Jesus Christ.

At this Thanksgiving time, we reflect on how God has been so faithful to us this past year. Family, friends, ministry, aging parents, hurting people, the world dying without Jesus are all things we think about with our work here in Brussels.
